#### 1. THE COMMISSION IN BRIEF

#### **1.1 Introduction**

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 83 of the Electricity Act, 2003, the Central Government constituted a two member (including Chairperson) Joint Electricity Regulatory Commission for all Union Territories except Delhi to be known as 'Joint Electricity Regulatory Commission for Union Territories' with Headquarters at Delhi, as notified vide notification no. 23/52/2003 – R&R dated 2nd May, 2005. Later with the joining of the State of Goa, the Commission came to be known as the 'Joint Electricity Regulatory Commission for the State of Goa and Union Territories' as notified vide notification no. 23/52/2003 – R&R (Vol. II) on 30th May, 2008. The Joint Electricity Regulatory Commission for the State of Goa and Union Territories started functioning with effect from August 2008. The office of the Commission is presently located in a rented building in the district town of Gurgaon, Haryana.

During the year the Commission has endeavored to set up a fair, transparent and objective regulatory process in the State of Goa and Union Territories. The present Annual Report, the Sixth of the Commission, presents the activities of the Commission during the Financial Year 2013-14.

The Commission, for the purpose of any inquiry or proceedings under the Electricity Act, 2003 has the same powers as are vested in a Civil Court under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 in respect of the matters listed under sub-section (1) of Section 94 of the Act.

All proceedings before the Commission are deemed to be judicial proceedings within the meaning of Sections 193 and 228 of the Indian Penal Code and the Commission is deemed to be a Civil Court for the purposes of Sections 345 and 346 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973. The Commission has the sole jurisdiction to adjudicate or nominate arbitrator(s) to arbitrate and resolve all disputes arising between generating companies and the licensees.

#### **1.2** Profile of Members of the Commission

Dr. V.K. Garg joined the Commission on 21st October 2008.

He is an MBA and has attended Advanced Management Programmes at Texas University USA and Cambridge University UK in addition to attending a course in Development of Finance Appraisal at Bradford University UK.


Dr. V.K. Garg after having served in the Indian Economic Service for 17 years shifted to the Public Sector to serve for another 17 years before he superannuated as Chairman and Managing Director of the Power Finance Corporation Ltd. Dr. Garg, a PhD in Business Administration, has served the Energy Sector and the Power and Oil Sector, in various capacities at senior positions. He was the Director (Finance) of the Power Grid Corporation Ltd for 8 years.

Under his leadership, the Power Finance Corporation made a successful transition from Mini Ratna to Navratna PSU, the highest recognition for any public sector company for its performance from the Government of India. He spearheaded the paradigm shift in the company's business, culture and operations. New business generated during his tenure of 39 months was worth Rs. 1.41 lakh Cr or US\$ 30 billion as against the total cumulative business of Rs. 1.86 lakh Cr generated in the last 22 years since inception. The PFC Initial Public Offer (IPO) under his stewardship was oversubscribed 77 times; Qualified Institutional Investors oversubscribed 136 times, a record for any PSU. The PFC Achieved one of the highest per capita productivity in India of post tax net profit of Rs. 4.3 Cr per employee per annum. It was also awarded three Ultra Mega Power Projects of 4000 MW costing US\$ 4 billion each at Sasan, Mundra & Krishnapatnam in private sector, through International Competitive Bidding in a record time.

He laid down the office of Chairperson, JERC on  $3^{rd}$  July, 2013, on attaining the age of sixty five years.


In a career spanning about 35 years, Sh. S. K. Chaturvedi has served in leading Public Sector Undertakings such as National Mineral Development Corporation, National Thermal Power Corporation, Power Grid Corporation of India and National Hydroelectric Power Corporation. He has the rare distinction of having experience in generation, both Thermal & Hydro, and Power Transmission Projects.

In August 2008, he was appointed as Chairman and Managing Director of 'POWERGRID, a Navratana CPSU, and took the challenge of developing the transmission system for the XI & XII Five Year Plan targets of Gol for the power sector. Under his leadership, POWERGRID, during FY 2008-09, 2009-10 & 2010-11, achieved significant milestones such as exceeding budget utilization target & Overall MoU targets, successful Follow on Public Offer (FPO) of shares in POWERGRID, timely commissioning of projects of national importance like National Load Despatch Centre (NLDC) project & prestigious consultancy assignment in Afghanistan etc.

Sh. Chaturvedi joined JERC, in May, 2012 initially as Member and subsequently assumed charge as Chairperson in Feb., 2014.

He has been conferred with many Awards, notably, "Best CEO Award 2009" by World HRD Congress, 'Change Master' Award by Delhi Chapter of National HRD Network, National HRD Network Award for Best HR Practices, PR Excellence Award by Public Relations Society of India and Fellowship of AIMA for professional contribution in the field of management.

Sh. Chaturvedi held the position of President of "Very large Power Grid operators of the world", and Vice Chairman "CBIP". He is currently holding the post of President "IIPE".



#### 2. THE MANDATE OF THE COMMISSION

The Electricity Act, 2003, aims at consolidating the laws relating to generation, transmission, distribution, trading and use of electricity and generally taking measures conducive to development of electricity industry, promoting competition therein, protecting interest of consumers and supply of electricity to all areas, rationalization of electricity tariff, ensuring transparent policies.

- 2.1 The Commission is vested with the responsibility of discharging the following functions:
- a) determine the tariff for generation, supply, transmission and wheeling of electricity, wholesale, bulk or retail, as the case may be;
- b) regulate electricity purchase and procurement process of distribution licensees including the price at which electricity shall be procured from the generating companies or licensees or from other sources through agreements for purchase of power for distribution and supply within the State;
- c) facilitate intra-state transmission and wheeling of electricity;
- d) issue licenses to persons seeking to act as transmission licensees, distribution licensees and electricity traders with respect to their operations within the State/Union Territories;
- e) promote cogeneration and generation of electricity from renewable sources of energy by providing suitable measures for connectivity with the grid and sale of electricity to any person, and also specify, for purchase of electricity from such sources, a percentage of the total consumption of electricity in the area of a distribution licence;
- f) adjudicate upon the disputes between the licensees, and generating companies and to refer any dispute for arbitration;
- g) levy fee for the purposes specified under this Act;
- h) specify State Grid Code consistent with the Indian Electricity Grid Code (IEGC) specified by Central Electricity regulatory Commission;
- i) specify or enforce standards with respect to quality, continuity and reliability of service by licensees;
- j) fix the trading margin in the intra-State trading of electricity, if considered, necessary;
- k) approval of Power Purchase Agreements, and
- 1) discharge such other functions as may be assigned to it under the Act.
- 2.2 The Commission has to advise the State/ Union Territory Government on all or any of the following matters, namely:-.
- a) promotion of competition, efficiency and economy in activities of the electricity industry;
- b) promotion of investment in electricity industry;



- c) reorganization and restructuring of electricity industry in the State/UTs
- d) matters concerning generation, transmission, distribution and trading of electricity or any other matter referred to the Joint Commission by the Government.
- 2.3 The Commission has to ensure transparency while exercising its powers and discharging its functions.
- 2.4 In discharge of its functions the Joint Commission is guided by the Electricity Act, 2003, the National Electricity Policy, National Electricity Plan and Tariff Policy.

#### 3. MISSION STATEMENT

The Joint Electricity Regulatory Commission is committed to fulfill its mandate for creating an efficient and economically viable electricity system in the State of Goa and the Union Territories, balancing the interests of all stakeholders while fulfilling its primary responsibility to ensure reliable supply of power at affordable rates and be guided by the principles of transparency, accountability, equitability and participation in discharge of its functions, to safeguard the interests of the licensees and generating companies in the State of Goa and the Union Territories and to give a fair deal to consumers at the same time.

#### To achieve the above, the Commission aims to:

- a) Promote competition, efficiency and economy in the activities of the Electricity Industry within the State of Goa and the Union Territories;
- b) Regulate effectively the power purchase and procurement process of the distribution licensees for sale, distribution and supply of electricity within the State of Goa & Union Territories;
- c) Encourage cogeneration and use of energy generated from Renewable Sources;
- d) Ensure consumer satisfaction with an effective mechanism to redress complaints urgently;
- e) Introduce open-access and reduce the cross-subsidy;
- f) Improve access to information for all Stakeholders.

#### 4.1 Issuance of Regulations

#### 4.3 Commission's Web Site

JERC has its own website <u>www.jercuts.gov.in</u> which is regularly updated to provide transparency, easy access and wide publicity to consumers and other stakeholders in respect of various activities being undertaken.

All Petitions, Orders, Tariff Orders, Regulations and other relevant notices are on the Commission's website, to ensure transparency and stakeholders' participation.

#### 4.4 Protecting Consumers' Interest

#### 4.4.1. Redressal of Grievances

The preamble of the Electricity Act, 2003 makes a specific mention of protecting the interest of consumers. The Act provides under Sub- section (5) of Section 42 for establishment of Forum for Redressal of Grievances of Consumers by every distribution licensee, in accordance with the guidelines as may be specified by the Joint Commission. Further, Sub-section (6) of Section 42 of the Act, provides for establishment of an authority known as Ombudsman to be appointed or designated by the Joint Commission. Any consumer of electricity who is aggrieved by non- redressal of his/ her grievance under Sub- section (5) can make a representation for redressal of his grievance to the Ombudsman.

The Joint Electricity Regulatory Commission (JERC) for Goa and UTs, has notified the regulations known as "JERC (Establishment of Forum for Redressal of Grievances of Consumers) Regulations, 2009" and "JERC (Appointment and Functioning of Ombudsman) Regulations, 2009". These are applicable in the State of Goa and UTs of Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep and Puducherry. They provide the procedures and guidelines to be followed in redressal of consumers' grievances.

These Regulations are available on the website of the Commission.

Each CGRF has the jurisdiction to entertain the complaints/ grievances of consumers with respect to electricity services provided by its Distribution licensee/Electricity Department.

CGRFs entertain any kind of complaint or grievance concerned with electricity supply to the consumers except those arising under Section 126 and 127 (unauthorized use of electricity), Section 135 to 139 (theft of electricity and offences and penalties thereof), and Section 161 (notice of accident etc) under the Electricity Act, 2003.

CGRFs do not entertain complaints or grievances if they pertain to the same subject matter for which any proceedings before any court of law or authority (except those under the control of distribution licensee) or the Forum are pending or a decree, award or a final order has already been passed.

CGRFs also do not entertain any complaint in regard to recovery of arrears where the billed amount is not disputed.

CGRFs may reject the complaint/ grievance at any stage if it appears that the same is frivolous, vexatious, malafide or without any sufficient cause or there is no prima facie loss or damage or inconvenience caused to the consumer. However, CGRFs provide an opportunity of being heard before rejecting the complaints of consumers on this account.

Model procedures for filing the complaints by consumers have been made available to all CGRFs and are also available on the JERC website. CGRFs have been advised to create awareness among consumers about the procedures for redressal of grievances as laid down by them and give wide publicity to the same by way of display on notice board at various bill collection centers and Sub- divisional/ divisional offices of the licensees, as well as on their websites. It has been advised that copies of the model procedures shall also be kept ready in the offices of CGRFs and licensees so that consumers of electricity, if they wish to have the same for their information or knowledge can collect it without any hindrance.

#### 4.4.4 Ombudsman Office:-

Electricity Ombudsman, a statutory authority has been appointed by the Commission for the State of Goa and UTs. The territorial jurisdiction of the Electricity Ombudsman extends to the whole State of Goa and UTs of Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep and Puducherry. Any consumer aggrieved by non- redressal of his complaint or grievance by CGRF has the option to make a representation for redressal of his/ her grievance or dispute to the Ombudsman. The Ombudsman has been entrusted with the task of settling the grievances or disputes of consumers as per the provisions of "JERC (Appointment and Functioning of Ombudsman) Regulations, 2009".

The Ombudsman, in the first instance, endeavours to settle the dispute by mutual agreement between the complainant and the licensee through conciliation or mediation. Failing settlement through agreement, the Ombudsman decides the matter in the dispute on the pleadings of the parties concerned i.e., the consumer and the licensee department.

Detailed procedure for submitting a representation to the Ombudsman has been laid down and displayed on the website of the Commission. This has also been sent to CGRFs and licensees for giving due publicity.



During the year 2013-14, ten representations were filed before the Electricity Ombudsman by the electricity consumers in the State of Goa and UTs of Chandigarh, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Puducherry and Lakshadweep. The number of representations and subject matter of these representations are detailed as under:

#### 4.5 Tariff Order

Tariff Orders on Aggregate Revenue Requirement and Tariff Petitions for FY 2014-15, received from Electricity Departments of Goa, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Chandigarh, Lakshadweep, Puducherry and Puducherry Power Corporation Ltd. (PPCL) could not be issued before 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2014 due to Code of Conduct being in force owing to General Elections in the Country. However, the tariff orders were issued as soon as the elections were over in the concerned State/UTs.




